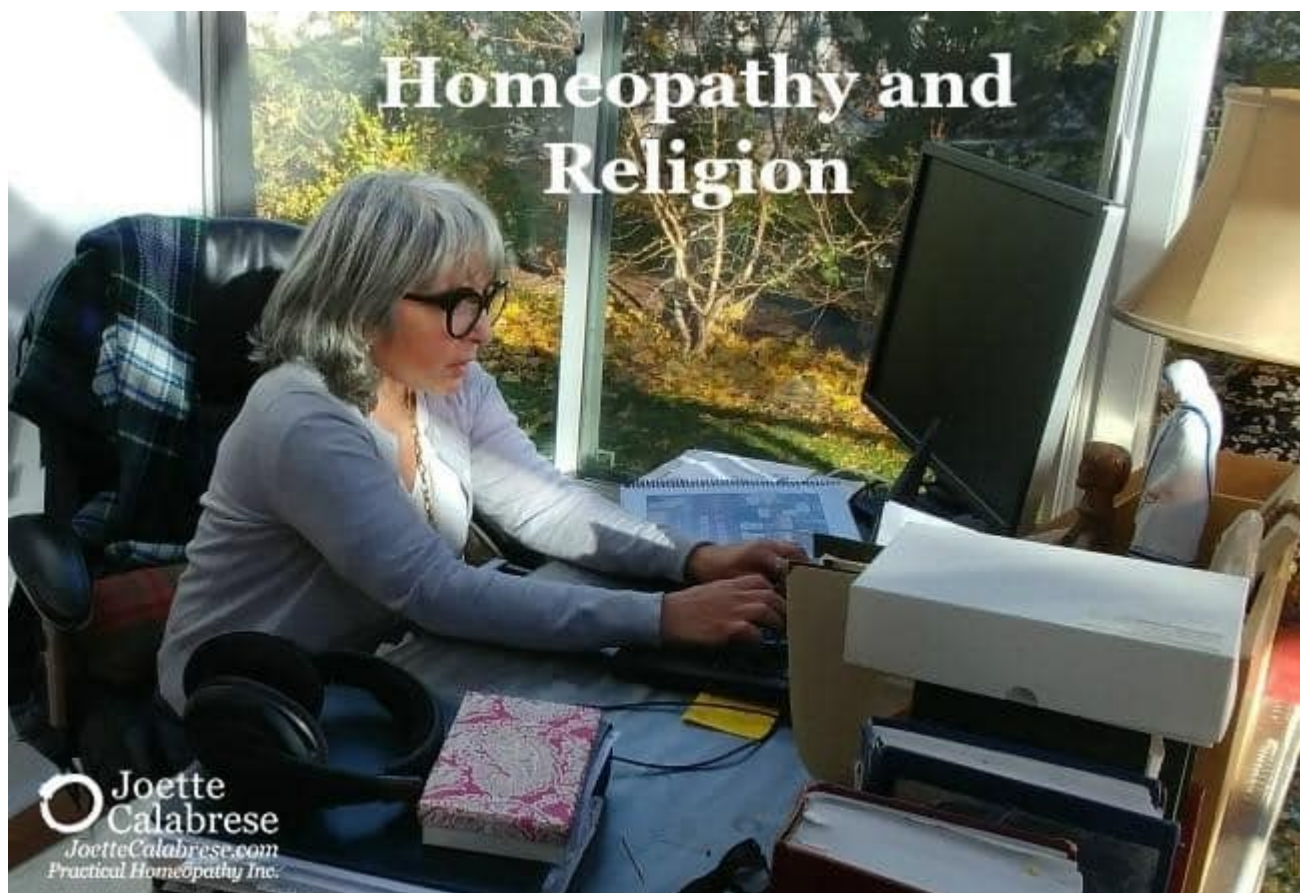


Homeopathy, Religion and Your Freedom to Practice Them
